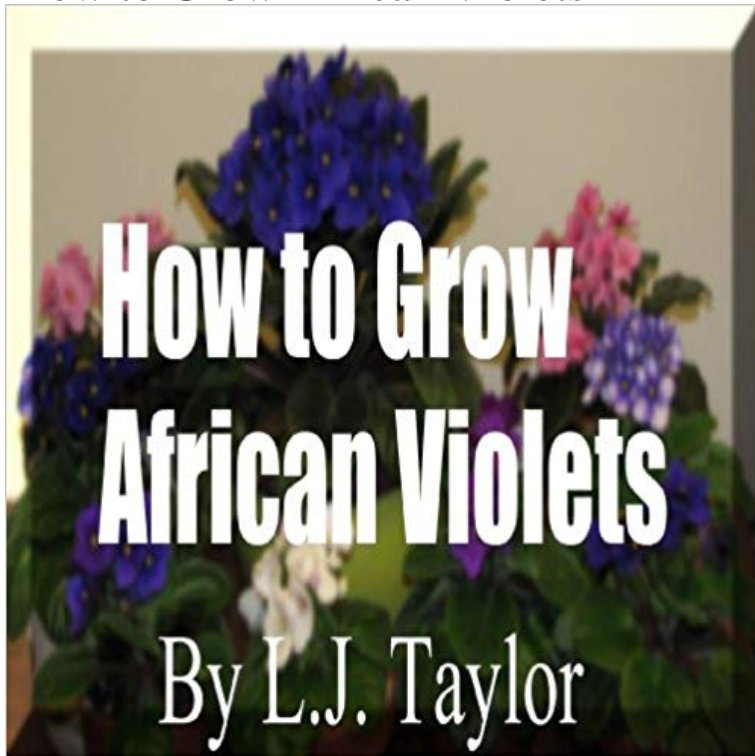

Keep the soil lightly moist every day and avoid getting the leaves wet. Fertilize every 2 weeks with a high phosphorous plant food, but only during the summer growing season.
