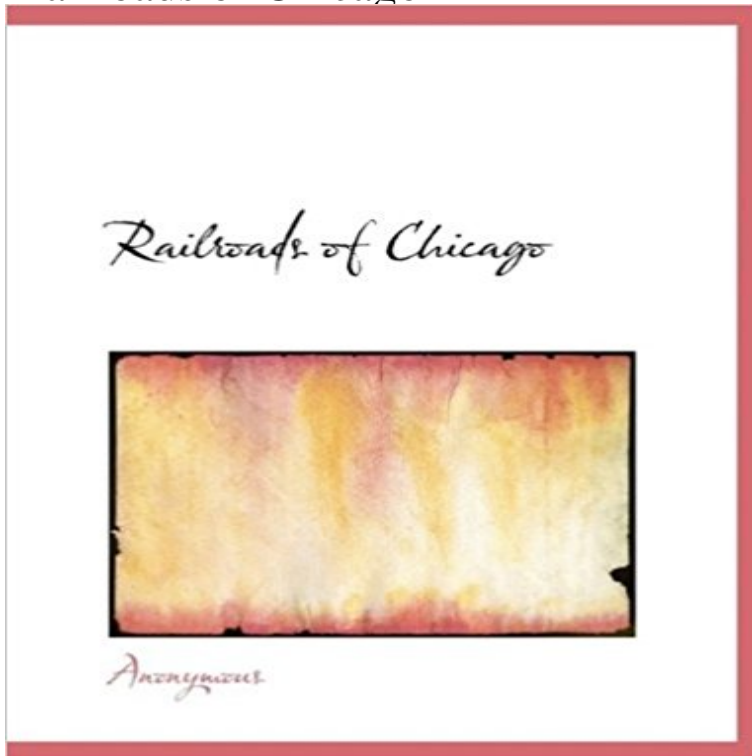


## Railroads of Chicago
