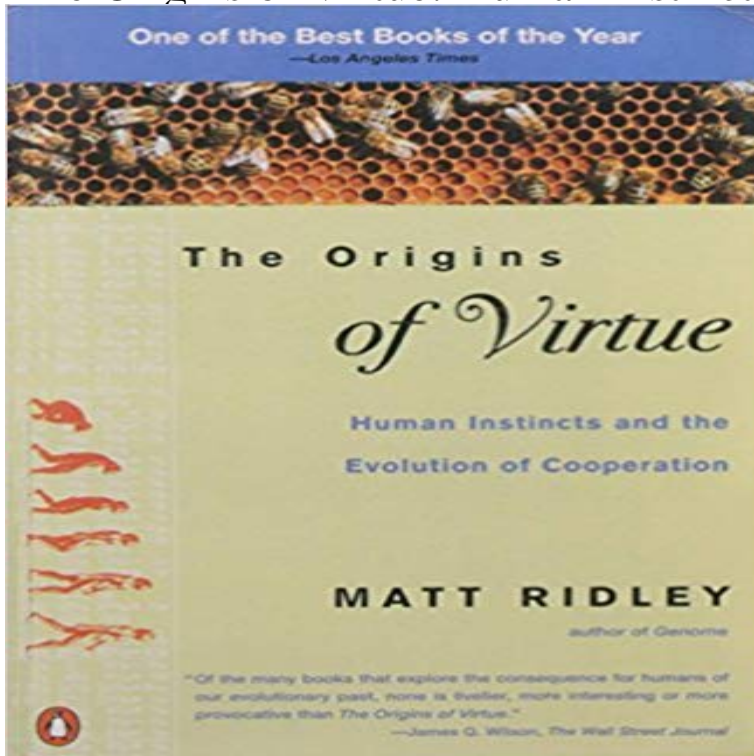


The Origins of Virtue: Human Instincts and the Evolution of Cooperation
