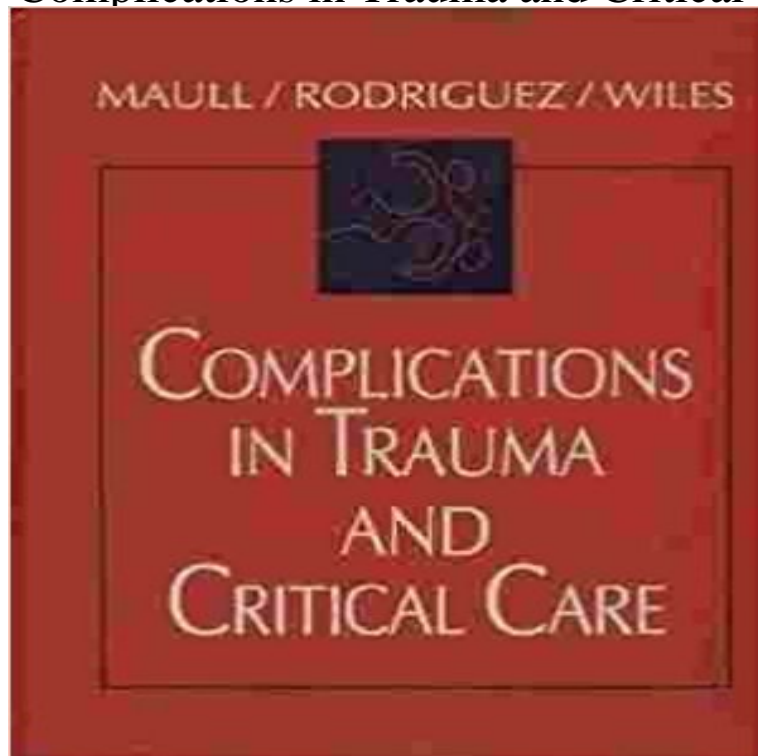


Complications in Trauma and Critical Care, 1e
