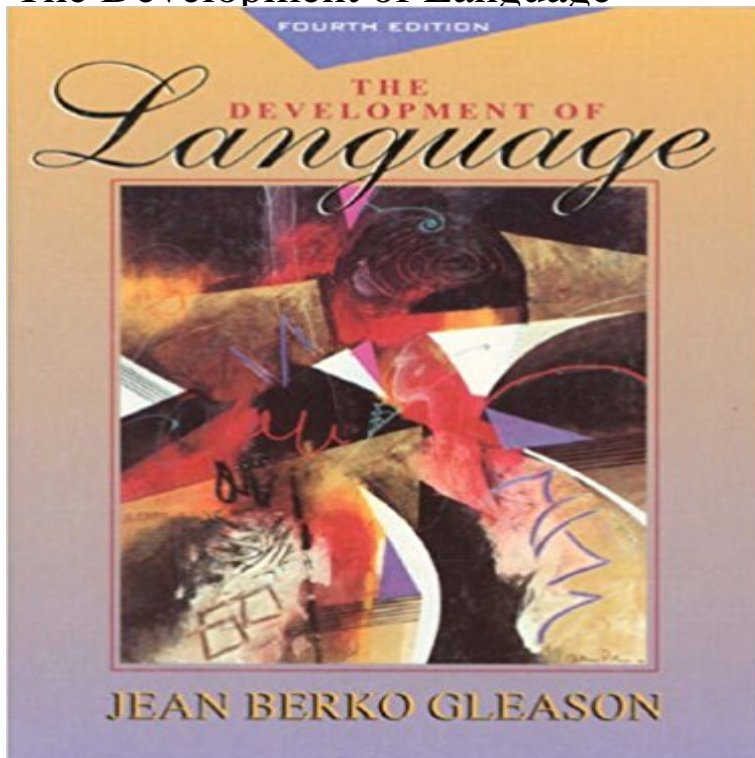


The Development of Language
