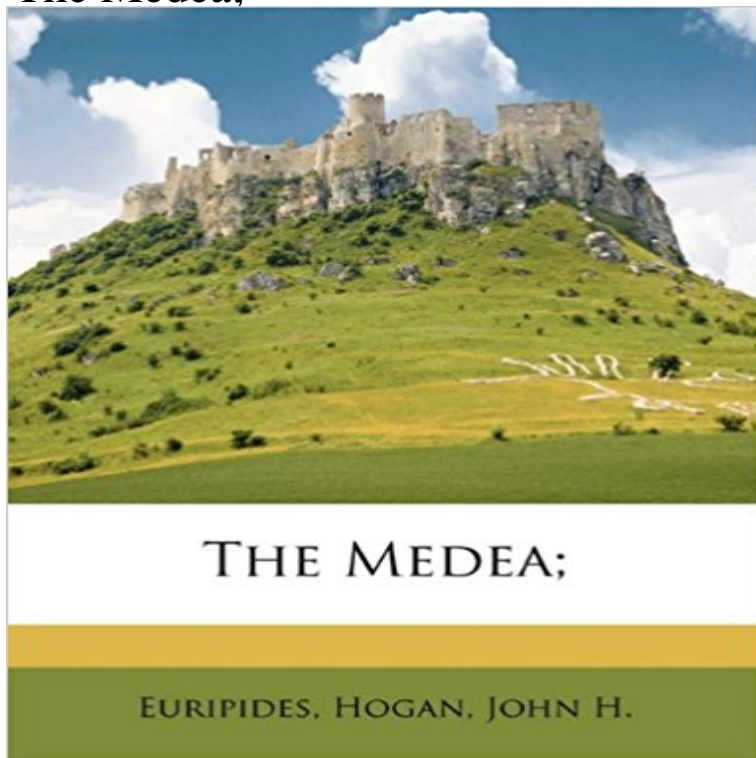


The Medea;
