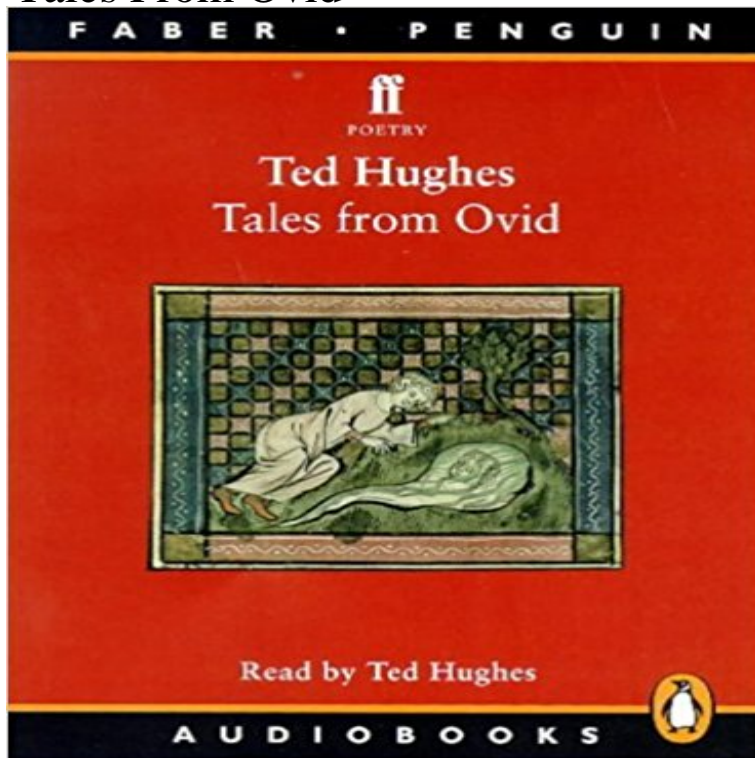


Tales From Ovid
