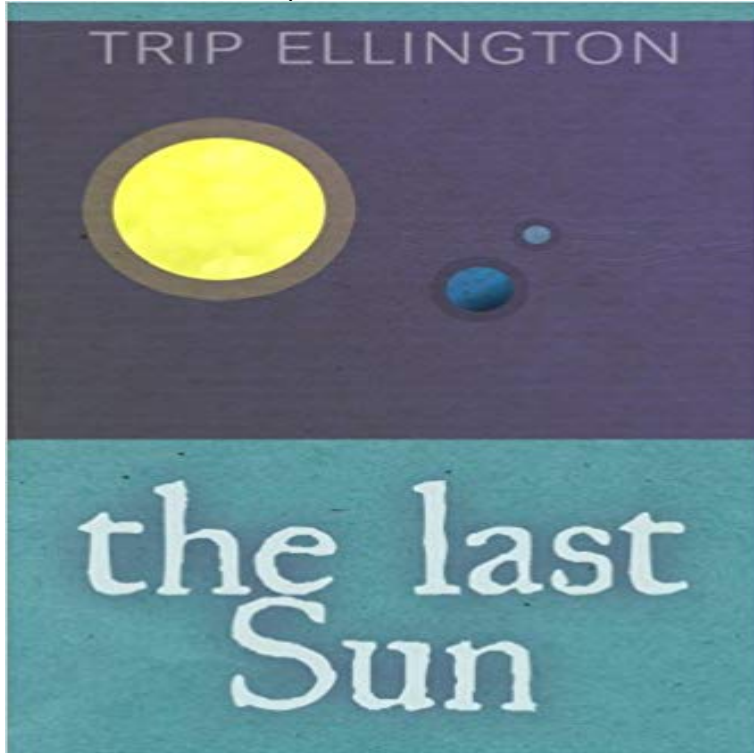


The Last Sun (Science Fiction Short Stories Book 1)
