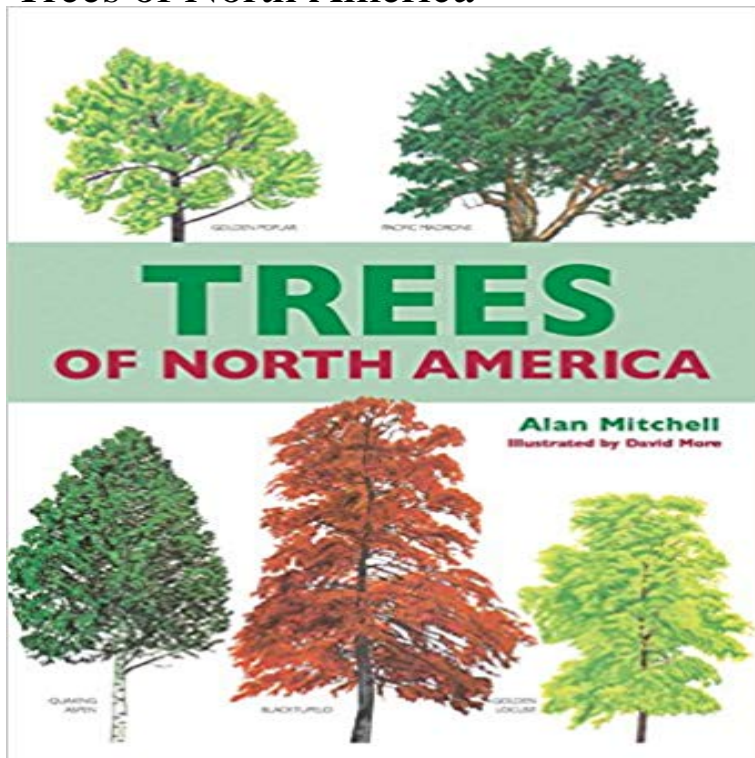


Trees of North America
