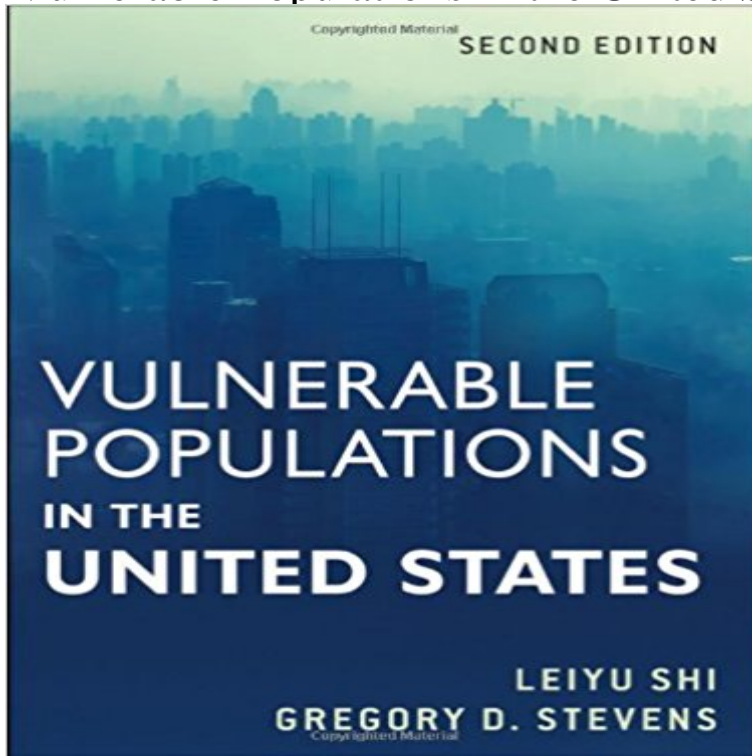


# Vulnerable Populations in the United States
